Direct Access IgG Antibody Tests



1. What is an IgG Antibody Blood Test for COVID-19?

Prairie Lakes Laboratory's IgG antibody test checks your blood by looking for antibodies, which show if you had a previous COVID-19 infection.

2. What does a test result mean for me?

• Results are informational only.

o An IgG test is not used to diagnose a current COVID-19 infection.

If you test positive:

- A positive test result shows you have antibodies that likely resulted from an infection with SARS-CoV-2, or possibly a related coronavirus.
- It's unclear if those antibodies can provide protection (immunity) against getting infected again. This means that we do not know at this time if antibodies make you immune to the virus.

If you test negative:

- You probably did not have a previous COVID-19 infection. It's possible you could still get sick if you have been exposed to the virus recently, since antibodies don't show up for 1 to 3 weeks after infection. This means you could still spread the virus.
- Some people may take even longer to develop antibodies, and some people may not develop antibodies.

Regardless of test results, guidelines published by the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) are still recommended for everyone.

- Wash your hands often
- Practice Social Distancing
 - Stay at least 6 ft from other people
 - Do not gather in large groups (greater than 10 people)
- o Cover your mouth and nose with a cloth face cover when around others
 - Wear a cloth face cover when in the public, unless you are under the age of 2 or have trouble breathing.
- If you cough or sneeze use the inside of your elbow or a tissue and wash your hands.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces.

3. Who can have an IgG Antibody Test?

Anyone can have a test who believes they had COVID-19 at a minimum of 8–10 days ago. This test is not intended to be used to diagnose a current infection of COVID-19.

4. How much does it cost?

The cost is \$70 and will be collected at the time of testing. The fastest method is payment by check. Insurance does not cover this test without a physician's order.

5. How do I take the test?

You will need to be without COVID-19 symptoms. This test requires a blood draw, which will be done in the Laboratory at Prairie Lakes Healthcare System.

No scheduling is necessary and testing is available:

- Monday Friday
- 8:00 a.m. 4:00 p.m.
- Enter through the Main Lobby and proceed to the Laboratory

6. How will I receive the results?

- Results can be mailed the following business day to the address you provide to staff upon payment.
- Results are available on your Prairie Lakes patient portal account.
- o Results can be picked up at the Prairie Lakes Laboratory 2 hours after your blood draw.
- Please note your results will not be mailed to your primary care provider as this test is for informational purposes only.

7. If you have COVID-19 symptoms now.

 Please stay home. If needed a symptom checker and more details are available at prairielakes.com or contact a healthcare provider to see if you should be tested.
